

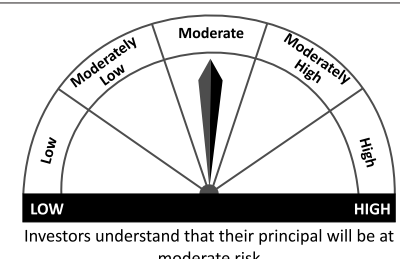


Notice for ICICI Prudential Fixed Maturity Plan - Series 70 - 367 Days Plan N (the Scheme)

This Product is suitable for investors who are seeking*:

- Short term savings solution.
- A Debt Fund that seeks to generate income by investing in a portfolio of fixed income securities/debt instruments maturing on or before the maturity of the Scheme.

*Investors should consult their financial advisers if in doubt about whether the product is suitable for them



NOTICE-CUM-ADDENDUM is hereby given to all the investors of the Scheme, in terms of enabling provisions of Regulation 33(4) of SEBI (Mutual Funds) Regulations, 1996, for rolling over (extension of maturity date) of the Scheme.

Pursuant to provision to Regulation 33(4) of SEBI (Mutual Funds) Regulations, 1996, it is proposed to roll over (extend the maturity date) the Scheme to October 23, 2017. The existing maturity date is October 18, 2016. The details and material terms of such roll over (extension of maturity date) are as follows:

- Purpose:** The purpose of the roll over (extension of maturity date) is to continue to benefit from the prevailing yields in the fixed income market taking into consideration the current economic and regulatory environment.
- Period:** 370 days. Accordingly, the revised maturity date of the Scheme will be October 23, 2017.
- Extended Maturity Date:** October 23, 2017 (or immediately following business day if the maturity date falls on a non-business day).
- Date of Roll over:** October 19, 2016 (or immediately following business day if the maturity date falls on a non-business day).
- Terms of roll over** (extension of maturity date): Upon roll over of the Scheme, certain provisions of the Scheme stand modified. The existing and modified provisions are stated below:

Securities with rating AA shall include AA+ and AA- respectively. Further, the allocation may vary during the tenure of the Scheme. The cut-off time to submit the approval slip or send the consent mail for the rollover is 6 p.m. on the maturity date. Any request received after 6 p.m. will not be processed. Please note that the approval slip or the mail should have Investor's name, folio number and the Scheme name, failing which the roll over request may not be accepted.

In view of the individual nature of the implications, each Unit holder is advised to consult his or her own tax advisors/financial advisors with respect to the specific amount of tax and other implications arising out of his or her participation in the Resetting the maturity of the Scheme.

The Trustee/AMC reserves the right to change/modify the provisions mentioned above at a later date.

This Notice-cum-Addendum forms an integral part of the SID/KIM/addenda of the Scheme of ICICI Prudential Mutual Fund, as amended from time to time.
